Why is family stuff so hard?

You can't fix them.

“... it is no mere pretense when I say that **I would be willing to be forever damned if that would save you.**” (Rom 9:1-3)

You can't fire them.

“The king covered his face and cried aloud, ‘O my son **Absalom!** O **Absalom**, my son, my son!’ Then Joab went into the house to the king and said, ‘Today you have humiliated all your men, who have just saved your life and the lives of your sons and daughters and the lives of your wives and concubines. **You love those who hate you and hate those who love you. You have made it clear today that the commanders and their men mean nothing to you. I see that you would be pleased if Absalom were alive today and all of us were dead.**’” (2 Sam 18:33- 19:6)
