3 Proper Perspectives

I work for the Lord.

"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, ***as working for the Lord, not for men,***" (Col 3:23)

I work like the Lord.

"For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:45)

My reward comes from the Lord.

"...since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving." (Col 3:24)

"Jesus replied, 'Let me assure you that no one has ever given up anything--home, brothers, sisters, mother, father, children, or property--for love of me and to tell others the Good News, who won't be given back, a hundred times over, homes, brothers, sisters, mothers, children, and land--with persecutions! All these will be his here on earth, and in the world to come he shall have eternal life. But many people who seem to be important now will be the least important then; and many who are considered least here shall be greatest there.'" (Mark 10:29-31)

We work because . . .

Working is God's ideal.
